

TENNANT CREEK

2-DAY ITINERARY

Two days is just enough time to explore the historical, natural and cultural attractions of the township of Tennant Creek. Experience a mix of historical and cultural attractions.

Day 1

Arrive in Tennant Creek and head up to Bill Allen Lookout to acquaint yourself with the town. The lookout offers clear 360-degree views across the landscape. Stop at the Pink Palace, a local art centre, where you can see the artists at work. Visit the Tennant Creek Telegraph Station, built in 1872. It houses a museum depicting the activities of the time. Watch the sun set at the Pebbles (Kunjarra). The Pebbles is an Aboriginal women's dreaming site, consisting of unusual granite boulders.

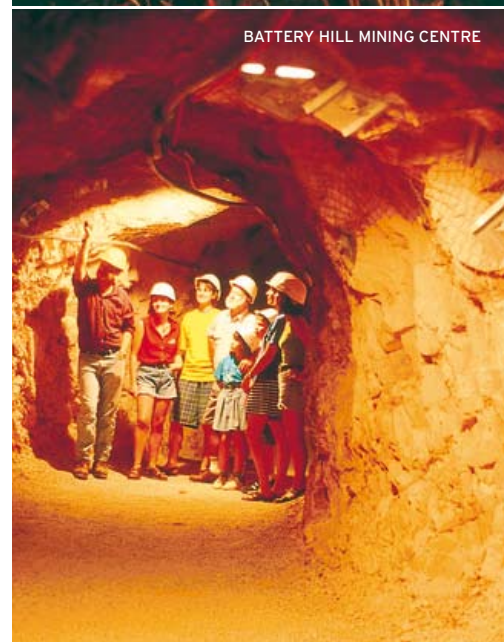
Day 2

Start your day by visiting the Battery Hill Mining Centre. The mining centre comprises a visitor information centre and mineral museum. Join a tour of the Tennant Creek Gold Stamp Battery, the only operating ten-head stamp battery in Australia. Follow it up with an underground mine tour to learn about the town's history.

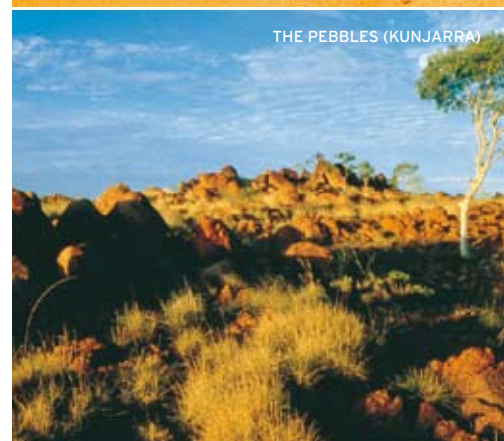
For lunch, head to Jajjikari Cafe in the Nyinkka Nyunyu Art and Culture Centre. Nyinkka Nyunyu offers travellers an opportunity to learn about Aboriginal life, history and land in the region. Explore the displays that encompass art, kinship relationships, bush medicine and dioramas depicting the modern history of the local Aboriginal people.
